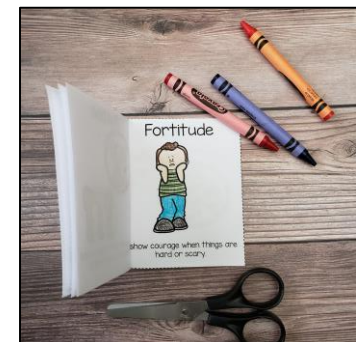


## Directions for Use - CUT & STAPLE VERSION

# Cardinal Virtues

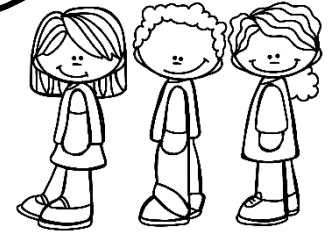

## Justice



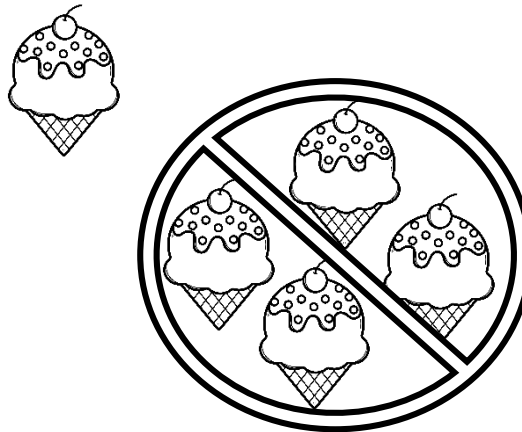
I show fairness to those around me and do what is right.

This information can be used to help explain the theological virtues or give more information for older students to add to their mini books.

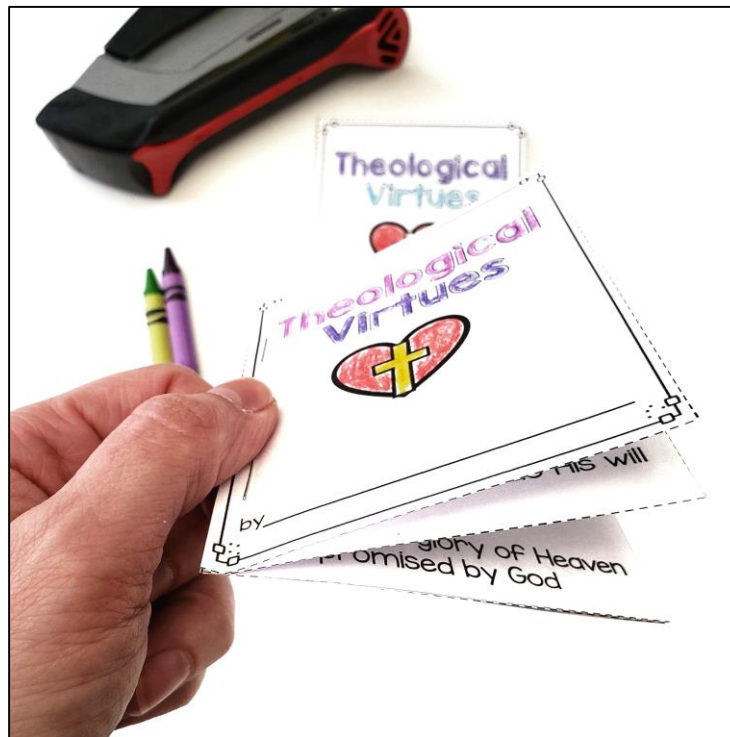
Prudence (sound judgment)	Guides the other virtues by setting rule and measure, enables us to reason and act rightly in any situation, guides the judgment of conscience
Justice (fairness)	Give to others and to God what is due them, respect the rights of others. promotes equity to persons and the common good,
Fortitude (courage)	Enables us to endure difficulties and pain for the sake of what is good, strengthens our resolve to resist temptations and overcome obstacles, conquer fear
Temperance (self-control)	Enables us to be moderate in pleasures and use of created goods, in the New Testament it is called moderation or sobriety

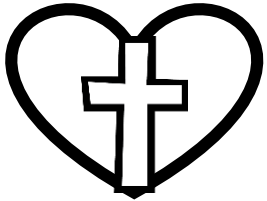
## Directions for Use - CUT & STAPLE VERSION

This is a great option for younger students so that there is no need to tape and accordion fold. This version will save time and paper and create a slightly larger mini book.

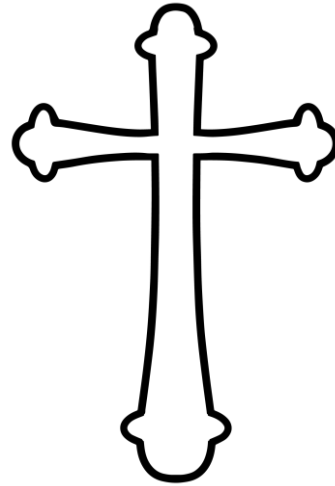
